

# Floofwoof

BUNDLE OF 6-IN-1 PATTERN



CROCHET PATTERN BY IRISSESILE

## Materials

- Super bulky chenille yarn size 6 (or any types of yarn and colors of your choice)
- Thin chennile yarn size 3 for the tongue
- Tulip Etimo hook 7/0 - 4.00 mm for size 6
- Tulip Etimo hook 6/0 - 3.50 mm for size 3
- A pair of 10 mm safety eyes
- Tapestry needle/darning needle, scissors & pins
- Stuffing materials
- Cotton yarn for sewing/embroidery thread
- Stitch marker or contrast color yarn

## TENSION NOTES

Maintaining a regular tension (neither too tight nor too loose) ensures that your stitches align consistently.

When crocheting your dogs, you might notice that some parts don't align perfectly at first. Once you've firmly stuffed the body and shaped the face, the stitches will settle into place. **Trust the process!**

### TIP

It's a great idea to read through before you start!





## Things To Know

- The height of the finished **Floofwoof** is approx. 10cm/4 inches.
- The materials mentioned are the materials I used to make the Floofwoof. You can change your yarn type, size and colors adjusting the appropriate crochet hook size. If you use a different yarn weight with a different gauge, the measurement of the dogs will also change.
- The Floofwoof dogs are crocheted seamlessly from the head down to the legs, without any need for sewing body parts together. However, a little sewing is necessary to shape the front legs, position the tail, ears, shaping the face and eyeliner/lashes.
- The tail hole is intentionally designed to be **slightly off-center** and will tend to be on the right side of the dog.
- To insert the eyes with backings, please refer to instruction in eyes placement on page
- When working on the body and legs, be aware that there are rounds where you'll need to alternate colors. This means switching between different yarn colors as you crochet. Pay attention to the pattern instructions during those rounds to achieve the desired color effect.
- Always use a stitch marker or yarn in a contrasting color to mark the beginning of the round.
- Please read the instructions carefully before you start each part and most of all, have fun!



## Alternative Pattern for Feet Adjustment

Some crocheters may be fine following the original pattern for the feet. However, due to varying tension levels, some feet might need stitch adjustment to align at the center. If you notice your dog's feet are slightly off, here are the alternative patterns for adjusting the feet. Please adjust the color changes as needed.

rnd 14 -15 for German Shepherd and rnd 15-16 for the other dogs.

### Alternative 1

<u>Rnd</u>	<u>Pattern</u>
15	16 sc, (hdc-inc) x3, 2 sc, (hdc-inc) x3, 16 sc (46)
16	(3 sc, dec) x3, 1 sc, skip the 6 hdc from previous rnd, 2 sc, skip again the 6 hdc from previous rnd, dec (3 sc, dec) x2, ch 3, skip 3 sts, 1 sc (28)

### Alternative 2

<u>Rnd</u>	<u>Pattern</u>
15	17 sc, (hdc-inc) x3, 2 sc, (hdc-inc) x3, 15 sc (46)
16	(dec, 3sc) x3, dec, skip the 6 hdc from previous rnd, 2 sc, skip again the 6 hdc from previous rnd, 1 sc (dec, 3sc) x2, ch 3, skip 3 sts, 1 sc (28)

If this adjustment still doesn't work for you, feel free to modify the sts and color changes yourself. Just remember to make similar adjustments in the following round as needed.



## Labrador/Golden Retriever

Yarn color: Soft brown/Golden yellow  
Embroidery yarn: Black, White

In the next round, you'll crochet using hdc to make the front feet. [photo 3]. Adjust the sts if needed [refer to page 4].		
15	18 sc, (hdc-inc) x3, 2 sc, (hdc-inc) x3, 14 sc	(46)
In the next round, you'll skip stitches to shape the feet and to crochet the tail later. [photo 4]		
16	(3 sc, dec) x3, 3 sc skip the 6 hdc from previous rnd, dec, skip again the 6 hdc from previous rnd, (3 sc, dec) x2, ch 3, skip 3 sts, 1 sc	(28)

Place 3 st markers in the 3 ch loops to find them easily when working on the tail later [photo 6]. Gently stuff the body, then continue to stuff it firmly as you go.

### Important Notes

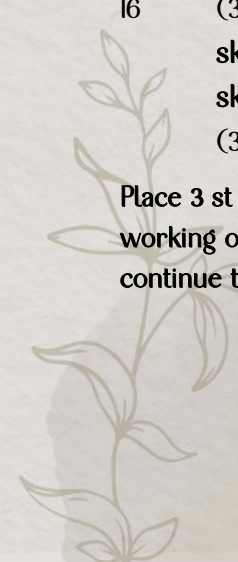
The Labrador Retriever pattern serves as the foundation pattern for all dogs. The contrast color yarn in the photo is for demonstration purposes only. It covers:

- How to do the front feet (closing and sewing)
- How to start and positioning the tail
- How to start and placing the ears correctly
- Face shaping
- Facial features (including eye placement, eyeliner/lashes, and embroidered nose tutorial)

If there are any extra details or specific instructions, they'll be included in each dog's pattern.

### Eyes Placement

If you prefer to use safety eyes with backings, insert them after you have finished crocheting the legs (rnd 15). Place them in between rnds 7 and 8, 2 sts before the hdc inc for left eye and 2 sts after the hdc inc for the right eye. Adjust the position if needed.

Cut off and leave a yarn tail. Using a yarn needle, sew with the yarn into the remaining front loops of the last round. Pull tight to close, cut off the yarn and weave in the end.

Use yarn in the same color as the body to close the front feet, work as if you're closing a round on the front loops only [photo 7]. Still using the same yarn, sew few sts to connect the feet and bring them closer together [photo 8]. Cut off and weave in all the yarn ends.



## Tail

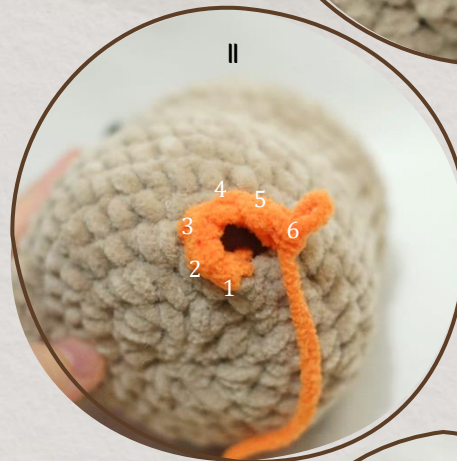
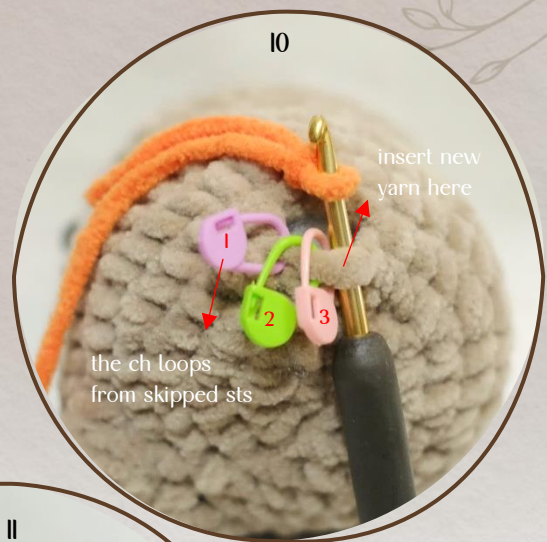
Each dog will have its own tail pattern, but the starting steps in this guide apply consistently to all dog designs.

Take a **new yarn** in the same color as the body, make a slip knot, and insert into the 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from the skipped sts of the body. [photo 10]

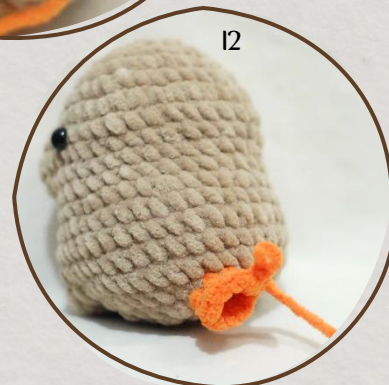
**[Optional]** Lightly stuff the tail to give it a subtle shape or leave it unstuffed for more natural floppy tail.

Cut off and leave a yarn tail, using a yarn needle, sew into the remaining front loops of the last round. Pull tight to close, cut off the yarn and weave in the end.

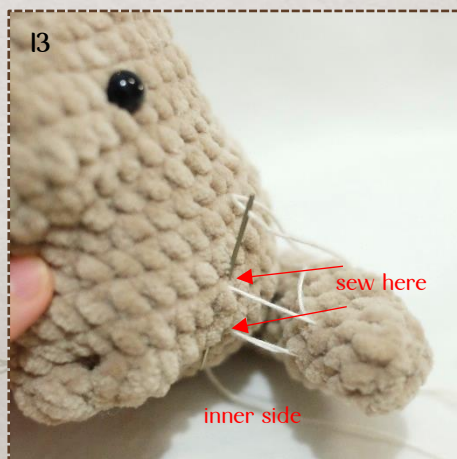


Insert the yarn starting from st 1, working clockwise to st 6 [photo 10-11], to have 6 sts (rnd 1).

If a small gap appears, you can sew it closed later using the yarn tail.



Position the tail when the dog is sitting flat before sewing, attach the tail to the right side by using a new cotton yarn strand in the same color as the dog. Sew few stitches on the inner side, close to the body in between rnd 14 and 15, as shown in the pictures [photo 13], which allows the tail to be attached to the body. Adjust the round and sts if needed.

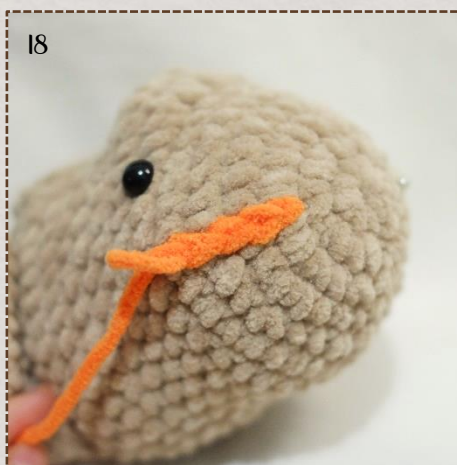
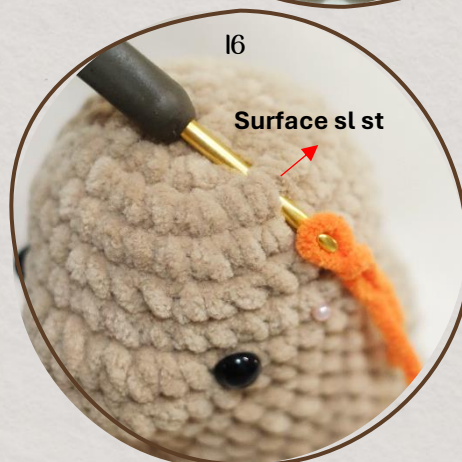
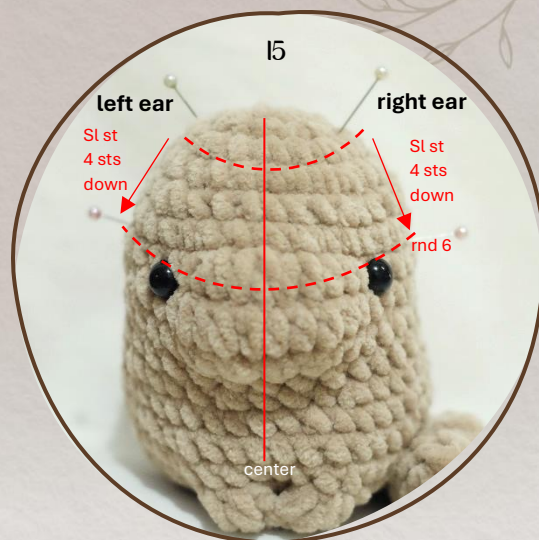


## Ears

Each dog will have its own ear pattern, but the starting steps in this guide apply consistently to all dog designs.

Mark the sts between rnd 2 & 3 and between rnd 6 & 7. Adjust the position of each ear so that they mirror each other. The ears should be at equal distances from the center line.

**Right & left ear:** insert the hook into the marked st between rnd 2 & 3 [photo 16], slip 4 stitches down over rnd 3, 4, 5 and 6, ch 1 and turn, skip the ch 1 [photo 17-18].



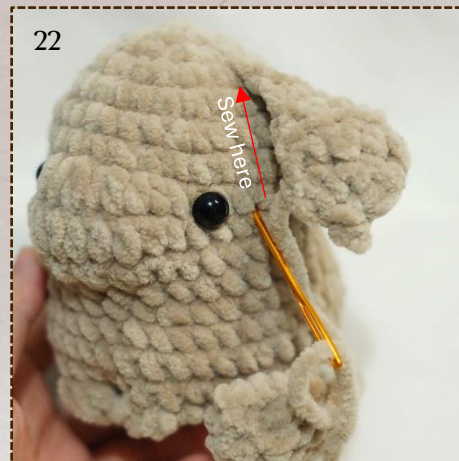
### Labrador Ears

Starts by inserting your hook under the slst [photo 19] and crochet:

**Row 1-4** - hdc in the next 4 sts, ch 1 and turn

**Row 5** - hdc2tog, ch 2, slst in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch, hdc2tog, ch 1 and sl st in the same st as the last hdc

Cut and leave long yarn tail for sewing later.



Fold the ears down as shown in the photo, then use the yarn tail to sew along the edge where the ears touch the face for a few sts [photo 22 & 27]. Tie off the yarn tail, trim any excess and tuck the remaining yarn inside the body.

## Tongue

Tongue pattern applies to all dogs.

Take a **new yarn** for the tongue color and work just 1 rnd in a MR.

**Rnd 1** - sl st, 2 sc, sl st

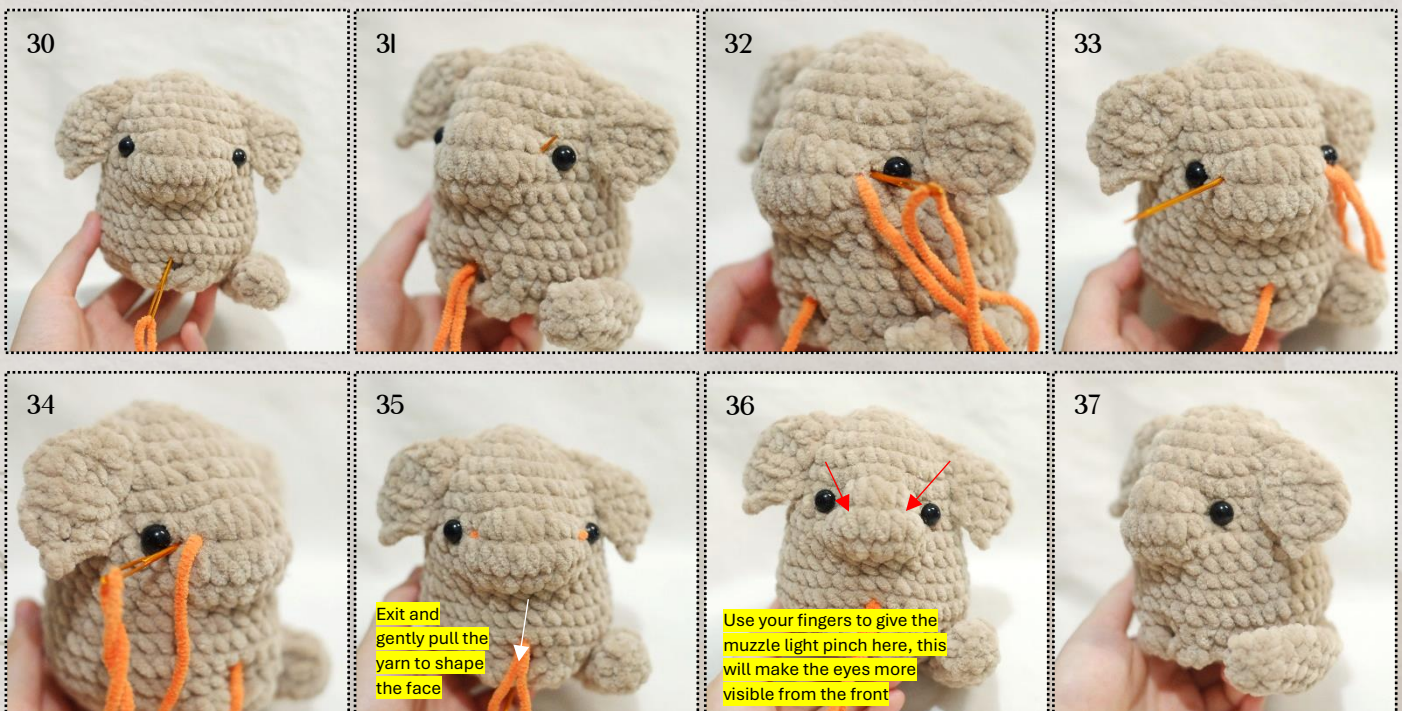
Pull the MR tail to close and leave a long yarn tail for sewing.



## Face Shaping

Take a new yarn in the same color as the body, pull the yarn from the bottom of the body coming out at the right side on the first sc after the hdc stitch and sew 1 st [photo 31-32]. Insert the needle again and pull the yarn through, coming out at the 1 sc before the hdc stitch at the left side and sew 1 st [photo 34]. Repeat these action one more time if needed.

Exit the yarn to the first entry point and pull tight [photo 35-36]. Knot the yarn securely, cut off and tuck in remaining end inside the body.





## Facial Features

To add some extra flair, consider adding eyeliner to the dog's eyes. You can use fine black thread to create the eyelashes and colorful thread to create a subtle eyeline around the eyes for extra depth.

To sew the nose, use black yarn, insert the needle in between round 7 & 8 of the muzzle [photo 39-40]. Embroider horizontal line few times in this area (around 3 sts) and sew a vertical line down the middle of the embroidery nose. To attach the tongue, sew it to the end of the vertical line of the nose [photo 40]



# Husky

Yarn color: Grey, White

Embroidery yarn: Black, Blue

Start with grey yarn

1 8 sc in a mr (8)

Place a stitch marker to mark the beginning of the round.

2 (inc) x8 (16)

3 (1 sc, inc) x8 (24)

4 1 rnd sc (24)

 grey 2 sc

Refer to page 4 for eye placement.

In the next round, you'll skip stitches to shape the feet and to crochet the tail later [refer to page 6 & 7]. Use grey yarn for the rest of the body.

16 (3 sc, dec) x3, 3 sc  
 skip the 6 hdc from previous rnd, dec,  
 skip again the 6 hdc from previous rnd,  
 (3 sc, dec) x2, ch 3, skip 3 sts, 1 sc (28)

Place 3 st markers in the 3 ch loops to find them easily when working on the tail later. Gently stuff the body, then continue to stuff it firmly as you go.

17 (2 sc, dec) x7 (21)

18 (1 sc, dec) x7 (14)

19 (dec) x7 (7)

Cut off and leave a yarn tail. Using a yarn needle, sew with the yarn into the remaining front loops of the last round. Pull tight to close, cut off the yarn and weave in the end.



## Ears

Use white & grey yarn.

For Husky, the surface sl st start in between rnd 1-2 and end in between 5-6. Refer to page 8 for the starting steps of the ears.

Start with white yarn

Rnd 1 - 2 hdc, 2 sc, ch 1, turn

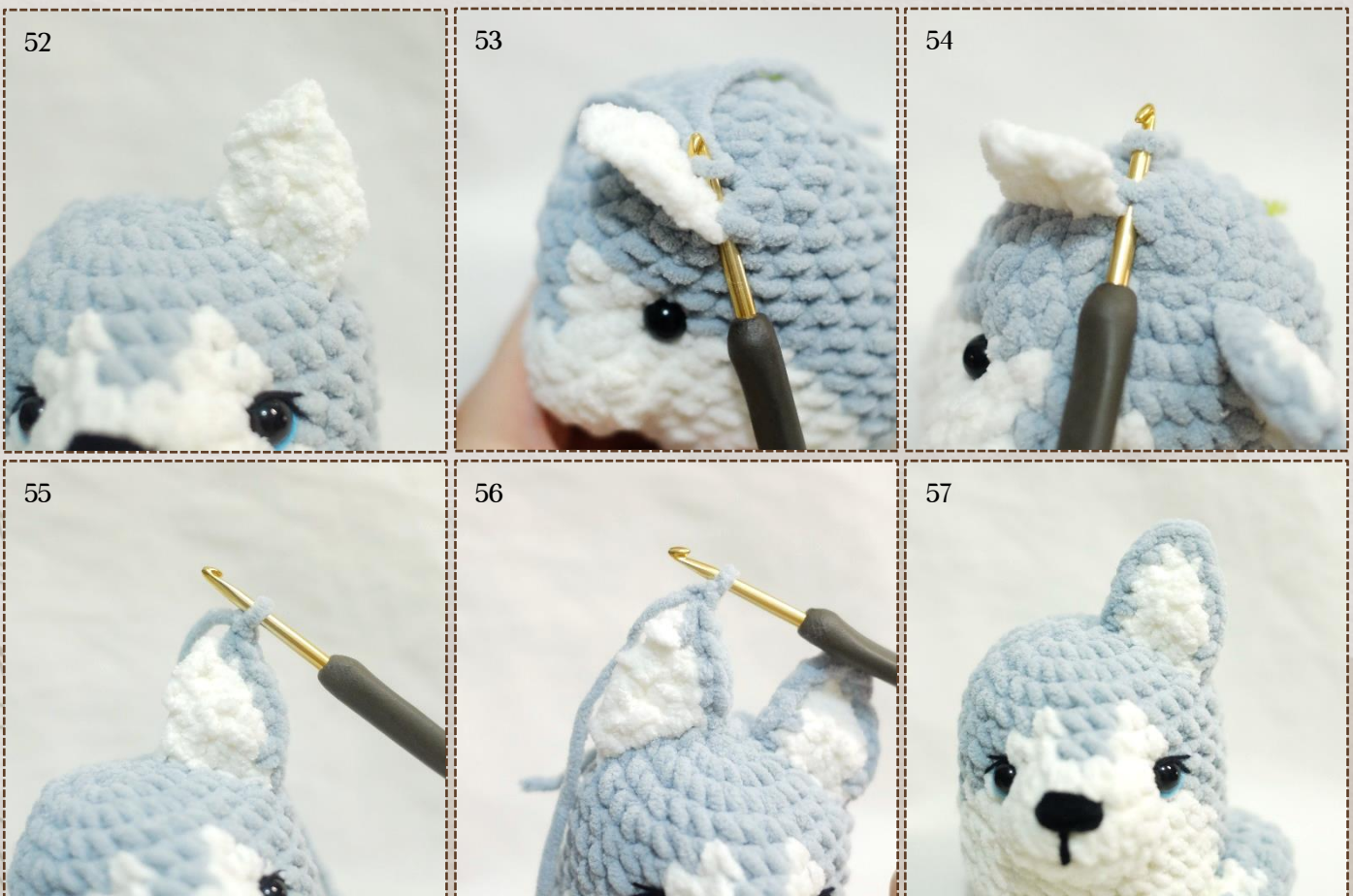
Rnd 2 - dec, hdc2tog, ch 1, turn

Rnd 3 - dec, ch 1, sl st in the same st as the last hdc

Cut off and weave in the yarn end.



Join a new grey yarn with a surface sl st by inserting the hook under the 4<sup>th</sup> sl st for the right ear and under the 1<sup>st</sup> sl st for the left ear [photo 53 & 54]. Then crochet around the white part: 5 sc, ch 1 at the pointy tip and 5 sc along the other side [photo 54-56]. Total of 10 sts, adjust the sc count if needed. Cut off and tuck in the yarn end inside the body.



## Tail

Refer to Labrador's pattern for **the starting steps** [page 7 - photo 10-II]. Use grey and white yarn  
Take a new **grey yarn**, make a slip knot, and insert into the 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from the skipped sts of the body.

**[Optional]** Lightly stuff the tail to give it a subtle shape or leave it unstuffed for more natural floppy tail.

### Eyebrows



Mark two points diagonally above each eye as shown in the picture [photo 60] Using white yarn and darning needle, sew 3 small sts in the same spot to make an eyebrow.

## Ears

Use black yarn.

Refer to Labrador's pattern - page 8 for **the starting steps** and sewing of the ears. Start by inserting your hook under the slst and crochet:

**Row 1-4** - hdc in the next 4 sts, ch 1 and turn

**Row 5** - hdc2tog, ch 2, slst in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch, hdc2tog, ch 1 and sl st in the same st as the last hdc

Cut and leave long yarn tail for sewing later.



Fold the ears down as shown in the photo, then use the yarn tail to sew along the edge where the ears touch the face for a few sts [photo 68]. Tie off the yarn tail, trim any excess and tuck the remaining yarn inside the body.



## German Shepherd

Yarn color: Black, Brown

Embroidery yarn: Black, White

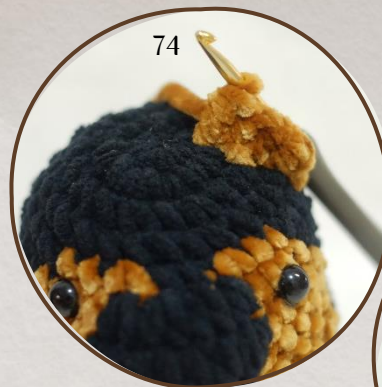

Cut off and leave a yarn tail. Using a yarn needle, sew with the yarn into the remaining front loops of the last round. Pull tight to close, cut off the yarn and weave in the end.

**Eye Placement for German Shepherd:**

Place the eyes in between rnds 6 and 7, 2 sts before the hdc inc for left eye and 2 sts after the hdc inc for the right eye. Adjust the position if needed.



**Ears**

Use brown and black yarn.

For German Shepherd, the surface sl st start in between rnd 1-2 and end in between 5-6. Refer to page 8 for the starting steps of the ears.

Starts with brown yarn

Row 1 - hdc in the next 4 sts, ch 1 and turn

Row 2 - hdc2tog, ch 2, slst in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch, hdc2tog, ch 1 and sl st in the same st as the last hdc

Cut and weave in the yarn end.

Join a new black yarn with a surface sl st by inserting the hook under the 4<sup>th</sup> sl st for the right ear and under the 1<sup>st</sup> sl st for the left ear [photo 77]. Then crochet around the brown part: 3 sc, ch 1 at the pointy tip and 4 sc along the other side [photo 78]. Total of 9 sts, adjust the sc count if needed. Cut off and tuck in the yarn end inside the body.



## Tail

Refer to Labrador's pattern for **the starting steps** [page 7 - photo 10-11]. Use black and brown yarn. Take a **new black yarn**, make a slip knot, and insert into the 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from the skipped sts of the body.

## Eyebrows



[Optional] Mark two points diagonally above each eye as shown in the picture [photo 82] Using brown yarn and darning needle, sew 3 small sts in the same spot to make an eyebrow.

Fur yarn will be used in rnd 11-13 or you can use white yarn instead.

11	<b>dark brown</b> (3 sc, inc) x3 <b>white/fur</b> (3 sc, inc) x2, 3 sc <b>dark brown</b> inc, (3 sc, inc) x2	(40)
12-13	2 rnds sc <b>dark brown</b> 14 sc <b>white/fur</b> 14 sc <b>dark brown</b> 12 sc	(40)
14	<b>dark brown</b> 1 rnd sc	(40)

In the next round, you'll crochet using hdc to make the front feet [refer to page 6]. Adjust the sts if needed [refer to page 4].

15	<b>dark brown</b> 18 sc <b>white</b> (hdc inc) x3 <b>dark brown</b> 2 sc <b>white</b> (hdc inc) x3 <b>dark brown</b> 14 sc	(46)
----	--	------

Refer to page 4 for eye placement.

In the next round, you'll skip stitches to shape the feet and to crochet the tail later [page 6 & 7].

Use **dark brown** yarn for the rest of the body.

16	(3 sc, dec) x3, 3 sc skip the 6 hdc from previous rnd, dec, skip again the 6 hdc from previous rnd, (3 sc, dec) x2, ch 3, skip 3 sts, 1 sc	(28)

Place 3 st markers in the 3 ch loops to find them easily when working on the tail later. Gently stuff the body, then continue to stuff it firmly as you go.

<u>Rnd</u>	<u>Pattern</u>	
17	(2 sc, dec) x7	(21)
18	(1 sc, dec) x7	(14)
19	(dec) x7	(7)

Cut off and leave a yarn tail. Using a yarn needle, sew with the yarn into the remaining front loops of the last round. Pull tight to close, cut off the yarn and weave in the end.

## Tail

Refer to Labrador's pattern for **the starting steps** [page 7 - photo 10-11]. Use dark or light brown for the whole tail, or you can mix it with fur yarn.

Take a **new brown yarn**, make a slip knot, and insert into the 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from the skipped sts of the body.

1	6 sc	(6)
2	(1 sc, inc) x3	(9)
3-6	4 rnds sc	(9)
7	(2 sc, inc) x3	(12)
8	1 rnd sc	(12)

Use fur yarn for the rest of the round.

9	1 rnd sc	(12)
10	(2 sc, dec) x3	(9)
11	1 rnd sc	(9)
12	(1 sc, dec)	(6)

**[Optional]** Lightly stuff the tail to give it a subtle shape or leave it unstuffed for more natural floppy tail.

Cut off and leave a yarn tail, using a yarn needle, sew into the remaining front loops of the last round.



## Ears

Use light brown & dark brown yarn.

Refer to Labrador's pattern - page 8 for **the starting steps**. Start by inserting your hook under the slst and crochet:

**Starts with light brown yarn**

**Row 1-2** - hdc in the next 4 sts, ch 1 and turn

**Row 3** - hdc2tog, ch 2, slst in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch,

hdc2tog, ch 1 and sl st in the same st as the last hdc

Cut and weave in the yarn end.



Join a new dark brown yarn with a surface sl st by inserting the hook under the 4<sup>th</sup> sl st for the right ear and under the 1<sup>st</sup> sl st for the left ear [photo 91].

Crochet around the light brown part: 5 sc, ch 1 at the pointy tip and 5 sc along the other side [photo 92].

Total of 10 sts, adjust the sc count if needed. Cut off and tuck in the yarn end inside the body.

# Pug

Yarn color: Light brown & Dark brown

Embroidery yarn: Black, White

## BODY

### Rnd Pattern

Start with **light brown** yarn.

1 8 sc in a mr (8)

Place a stitch marker to mark the beginning of the round.

2 (inc) x8 (16)

3 (1 sc, inc) x8 (24)

4 1 rnd sc (24)

5 (2 sc, inc) x8 (32)

6 1 rnd sc (32)

In the next round, you'll crochet using hdc to make the muzzle.

7 **light brown** 14 sc  
**dark brown** (hdc inc) x4  
**light brown** 14 sc (36)

8 **light brown** 14 sc  
**dark brown** 8 hdc  
**light brown** 14 sc (36)

9 **light brown** 14 sc  
**dark brown** (hdc2tog) x4  
**light brown** 14 sc (32)

10 **light brown** 14 sc  
**dark brown** 4 sc  
**light brown** 14 sc (32)

Use **light brown** yarn for the rest of the body.

11 (3 sc, inc) x8 (40)

12-14 3 rnds sc (40)

In the next round, you'll crochet using hdc to make the front feet [refer to page 6]. Adjust the sts if needed [refer to page 4].

15 18 sc, (hdc-inc) x3, 2 sc, (hdc-inc) x3, 14 sc (46)

### Rnd Pattern

16 (3 sc, dec) x3, 3 sc  
 skip the 6 hdc from previous rnd, dec,  
 skip again the 6 hdc from previous rnd.  
 (3 sc, dec) x2, ch 3, skip 3 sts, 1 sc (28)

Place 3 st markers in the 3 ch loops to find them easily when working on the tail later. Gently stuff the body, then continue to stuff it firmly as you go.

17 (2 sc, dec) x7 (21)

18 (1 sc, dec) x7 (14)

19 (dec) x7 (7)

Cut off and leave a yarn tail. Using a yarn needle, sew with the yarn into the remaining front loops of the last round. Pull tight to close, cut off the yarn and weave in the end.



## Ears

Use **dark brown** yarn.

Refer to Labrador's pattern - page 8 for **the starting steps** and sewing of the ears. Start by inserting your hook under the slst and crochet:

**Row 1** - hdc in the next 4 sts, ch 1 and turn

**Row 2** - (hdc2tog) x2

**Row 3** - hdc, ch 2, sl st in the 2<sup>nd</sup> ch, hdc, ch 1, sl st in the same st as the last hdc

Cut and leave long yarn tail for sewing later.

Fold the ears down as shown in the photo, then use the yarn tail to sew along the edge where the ears touch the face for a few sts [photo 101]. Tie off the yarn tail, trim any excess and tuck the remaining yarn inside the body.



## Tail

Refer to Labrador's pattern for the starting steps [page 7 - photo 10-11]. Take a new **light brown**, make a slip knot, and insert into the 3<sup>rd</sup> ch from the skipped sts of the body [photo 18].

Rnd	Pattern	
1	6 sc	(6)
2	(1 sc, inc) x3	(9)
3-6	4 rnds sc	(9)
7	(2 sc, inc) x3	(12)

Rnd	Pattern	
8-9	2 rnds sc	(12)
10	(2 sc, dec) x3	(9)
11	1 rnd sc	(9)
12	(1 sc, dec) x3	(6)

**[Optional]** Lightly stuff the tail to give it a subtle shape or leave it unstuffed for more natural floppy tail.

Cut off and leave a yarn tail, using a yarn needle, sew into the remaining front loops of the last round. Pull tight to close, cut off the yarn and weave in the end.

## Pug's Face Shaping

Use cotton yarn and darning needle to shape the face. Place sewing pins to mark 2 sts under the muzzle (photo 102) insert the yarn from the top of the head, pull through those two points, and exit back where you started [photo 103]. Repeat once more if needed, then pull tight to create a small dip under the muzzle where you will sew the tongue.
